

From the Editor's Desk



In 2019, the Indian Union government stated that 6.7% of its population lived below its official poverty limit. The second edition of the Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) released by NITI Aayog, showed that approximately 14.96% of India's population was considered to be in a state of multidimensional poverty. With a population of 1.4 billion people, such statistics imply that India has millions suffering the deprivations of poverty, a major repercussion of which is the lack of adequate access to quality medical treatment. The condition is worse in rural India with poverty rates being higher there than in urban areas. The government has been proactive in dealing with this problem; in 2018, the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Aarogya Yojana was launched which is the world's largest health insurance scheme launched and fully financed by the government. Despite great advances having been made in the past few years, the health and social challenges faced by people living in remote villages of India are still rampant. Leave aside elective surgical services, even emergency services are not available in many remote locations in India. This is because educated medical professionals prefer working in cities to avail a higher quality of life for themselves and their families. Rural postings, mandated by the government, are temporary and usually reserved for junior doctors who lack experience

In 2009 a group of professionals, in an effort to give back to society, initiated the concept of conducting surgical ventures in such locations. The Project was initiated in a village called Shillai in Himachal Pradesh where utero vaginal prolapse was rampant. This work was presented in a paper published in the Journal of Midlife Health "Reaching the Unreached: Mobile Surgical Campus in remote villages of Himachal Pradesh "where in the demography & surgical interventions in these patients were studied in detail and regular work in hilly terrains was initiated on a larger scale.

A unique model of raising funds from family, friends and CSR was combined with recruiting experienced doctors from the city who offered their services as volunteers and with the help of community participation, surgeries were conducted in the village hospitals at low costs. Okti identified village medical centres that had the infrastructure needed to perform specialized surgery and organized surgical camps with the support of local community authorities.

Under this model, specialized surgical services were brought to the doorstep of the rural poor who could not afford to travel to cities for treatment. Surgeries were performed at heavily subsidized rates, the only cost charged being that for medicine and boarding and that too was sponsored. This meant that people who had been suffering for years to prevent their families from going into debt in order to cover their surgical costs were finally able to get the medical attention they needed. Okti largely focused on performing gynaecological procedures; women being lower in priority for receiving medical help compared to the male members in rural households. Patients with genital prolapse either do not report or report late to the clinician due to social stigmata and myths considering and accepting it to be secondary to ageing. Women residing in remote villages of India suffer from the complications of genital prolapse due to lack of awareness, resources and fear of surgery. Project Prolapse ended their spell of social ostracization and neglect, bringing back their quality of life. The entire expenditure on surgery and food is borne by the organization. Not only did Okti bring medical relief to the unreached in India, but also enabled skill development and capacity building on the village level to create a more sustainable model of aid. Village-level workers were trained in performing life-saving procedures, and incorporated into Okti's network of providing aid. They were also trained to identify more serious cases that needed treatment in the cities, in which case Okti brought them to Delhi and bore the cost of their treatment.

Till date, the surgical team under Okti Foundation has helped more than 5800 beneficiaries in 117 camps in remote villages of India in a self-sustaining model. The free mobile surgical camps under Project Prolapse in remote villages of India provided definitive treatment to these women. Health education, care of postmenopausal women, approaching trained birth attendants for delivery, delayed resumption to work in the postpartum period, and healthy dietary habits may decrease the burden of women suffering from genital prolapse.

Thus, with the support of like-minded individuals in our community possessing both financial resources and compassionate spirits, the OKTI Foundation was conceived.

Over the span of 18 years since our inception, numerous others have contributed whatever aid they could offer, including counselling, elderly home care, health education, awareness initiatives, improved accessibility for girls and women, assistance for victims of pain and abuse, and academic opportunities aimed at enhancing surgical skills. We have consistently conducted complimentary surgical camps in underserved areas, a tradition that endures to this day.

Throughout this journey, some of our aspirations have materialized into tangible achievements. Our interconnectedness has begun to erode the unnecessary barriers that once divided us, albeit in modest ways. Light is penetrating the shadows that once enveloped our world. It is said that many drops make an ocean, and thus, we persist in our endeavours with unwavering hope.

We extend an invitation for you to contribute in any capacity you can to OKTI—whether through your talents, time, space, ideas, or financial resources. Every contribution, regardless of its form, is invaluable, for together, we can achieve feats that would have been inconceivable alone. Let us envision a future, five years hence, where our collective efforts have propelled us toward unprecedented achievements.


Awards Won by Okti Foundation ...
