In the summer of 2025, as Okti enters its 16th year of service, we reflect on a year marked by significant strides in healthcare, particularly in the realm of women's health. The Okti Foundation, steadfast in its mission to serve underserved communities, has not only expanded its outreach but has also aligned its efforts with national initiatives aimed at combating cervical cancer.

In January 2025, the Indian Medical Association (IMA) and the Federation of Obstetric and Gynaecological Societies of India (FOGSI) launched a collaborative effort to train 50,000 physicians, including gynecologists and pediatricians, across Tier 2, Tier 3, and Tier 4 cities. This initiative focuses on enhancing awareness about cervical cancer and promoting the uptake of the Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine, a critical tool in preventing this disease. This initiative builds upon the government's earlier commitment, announced in the 2024 Union Budget, to encourage HPV vaccination for girls aged 9 to 14 years as a preventive measure against cervical cancer.

The Okti Foundation has actively supported these endeavors by integrating cervical cancer awareness and HPV vaccination drives into our medical outreach programs. Okti is proud to share that this year, we visited a red light district in Delhi to do the same on the occasion of World Cancer Day. Our surgical camps have incorporated educational sessions, and our collaboration with local healthcare providers has facilitated the dissemination of accurate information and increased vaccine accessibility.

In this report, we present not just statistics but the human stories behind them—the lives changed, the communities empowered, and the hope restored. As we look ahead, we reaffirm our mission: to reach the unreached and heal those left behind. Let this report serve as both a record of our progress and a call to action. Every small effort contributes to a larger movement, and we invite you to be a part of this journey.

ABOUT US

In 2009, a group of professionals, in an effort to give back to society, initiated the concept of conducting surgical ventures in such locations. The Project was initiated in a village called Shillai in Himachal Pradesh where utero vaginal prolapse was rampant. This work was presented in a paper published in the Journal of Midlife Health, "Reaching the Unreached: Mobile Surgical Campus in remote villages of Himachal Pradesh, "where the demography & surgical interventions in these patients were studied in detail and a regular work in hilly terrains was initiated on a larger scale.

A unique model of raising funds from family, friends and CSR was combined with recruiting experienced doctors from the city who offered their services as volunteers and with the help of community participation, surgeries were conducted in the village hospitals at low costs. Okti identified village medical centres that had the infrastructure needed to perform specialized surgery, and organized surgical camps with the support of local community authorities.

Under this model, specialized surgical services were brought to the doorstep of the rural poor who could not afford to travel to cities for treatment. Surgeries were performed at heavily subsidized rates, the only cost charged being that for medicine and boarding and that too was sponsored. This meant that people who had been suffering for years to prevent their family from going into debt in order to cover their surgical costs were finally able to get the medical attention they needed. Okti largely focused on performing gynecological procedures; women were given lower priority for receiving medical help compared to the male members in rural households. Patients with genital prolapse either do not report or report late to the clinician due to social stigmata and myths, considering and accepting it to be secondary to ageing. Women residing in remote villages of India suffer from the complications of genital prolapse due to a lack of awareness, resources and fear of surgery. Project Prolapse ended their spell of social ostracization and neglect, bringing back their quality of life. The entire expenditure on surgery and food is borne by the organisation. Not only did Okti bring medical relief to the unreached in India, but it also enabled skill development and capacity building at the village level to create a more sustainable model of aid. Village-level workers were trained in performing life-saving procedures and incorporated into Okti's network of providing aid. They were also trained to identify more serious cases that needed treatment in the cities, in which case Okti brought them to Delhi and bore the cost of their treatment.

To date, the surgical team under Okti Foundation has helped more than 5900 beneficiaries in 124 camps in remote villages of India in a self-sustaining model. The free mobile surgical camps under the Project Prolapse in remote villages of India provided definitive treatment to these women. Health education, care of post menopausal women, approaching trained birth attendants for delivery, delayed resumption to work in the postpartum period, and healthy dietary habits are a few aspects which Okti spreads awareness on to decrease the burden of women in rural India.

B. Academic Activities

Video Workshop on Urogynaecology

Video Workshop on Urogynaecology was held on 3 Oct 2024 in the Auditorium of Sant Parmanand Hospital, Delhi. It was organized by Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Sant Parmanand Hospital in association with Sir Ganga Ram Hospital, Delhi to learn various tips & tricks to perform vaginal & urogynaecological surgeries through video sessions. The Workshop was attended by gynaecologist, urogynaecologists and gynae trainees. The event attracted nearly 58 attendees, including senior doctors from both private and government institutes, as well as postgraduate students. The workshop concluded that vaginal route can be safely used for many gynaecological surgical problems with minimum complications and speedy recovery.



1st Masterclass on Vaginal Surgeries

The Society of Vaginal Surgeons of India & Delhi in association with DGF Civil Lines Forum and Okti Foundation, organized the 1st Masterclass on Vaginal Surgeries from January 6th to January 24th, 2025. The program was structured into six modules, featuring 26 lectures. The course was guided by Dr. Sharda Jain, Dr. Manju Puri, and Dr. Kishore Rajurkar with Dr. Sonal Bathla serving as the convenor. The event saw active participation from 70 delegates and 26 faculty members. The course content covered a comprehensive range of topics, including Basic Vaginal Surgeries, Pelvic Organ Prolapse, Nondescent Vaginal Hysterectomy Perineal Surgeries, Surgeries for Urinary Incontinence This successful model was supported by the IT Department of Sant Parmanand Hospital enabling students from remote locations to attend sessions on various vaginal surgeries. The interactive format allowed for one-on-one discussions with expert faculty, ensuring personalized learning. Each faculty member was a master in their field, addressing delegates queries with precision. The experience was highly gratifying for the faculty and provided a valuable learning opportunity for participants who could enhance their surgical expertise from the comfort of their work place with much less expense. The funds raised from this event were initialized for the surgical camp.



NZ SOVSI India Conference Report

"North Zone Conference of the Society of Vaginal Surgeons of India" was organized by Department of obstetrics & Gynaecology , HIMSR in association with SOVS D on 8th & 9th February, 2025 along with release of "Gynae surgery module (3rd edition) and Special issue of Pan Asian Journal. Dr Hara Pattanaik & Dr Sonal Bathla represented SOVSI & Dr Kishore Rajurkar & Dr Uma Swain represented the SOVSD.

It was a 2-day event with lectures and panel discussions on the first day and live demonstration of surgeries from OT on the second day. There were 15 didactic lectures and 3 panel discussions on the first day elaborating and analyzing the various aspects of different vaginal surgeries. It was attended and well appreciated by around 200 delegates from different states including faculty. There were around 44 paper/poster/video presentations by candidates from Delhi and outside. All the abstract were published in Pan Asian Journal of Obstetrics & Gynaecology.

The second day had live transmission of 10 different vaginal surgeries distributed over 5 different sessions from the OT. Operating faculty included Dr Hara Patnaik Dr Ashish Kubde, Dr Ashok Todani, Dr Mukesh Rathi, Dr Nikhil Khattar, Dr Uma Rani. The conference was a huge success in terms of not only the scientific deliberations and excellent surgeries but also because of the well organized and executed hospitality and arrangements.



C. Social Causes

Women Health Camp March 2024

Health Camp for women was conducted by Friends of Sant Parmanand in collaboration with Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology Sant Parmanand Hospital under the aegis of NARCHI, Okti Foundation, Indian Society of Colposcopy & Cervical Pathology, AOGD, DGF Civil Lines & Indian Menopause Society on 5th March 2024. Total of 23 women participated in the health check up & underwent screening for cervical cancer, breast cancer & endometrial cancer by VIA & VILI, clinical breast examination and transvaginal ultrasound respectively. 18 patients had undergone HPV testing. All the patients were tested screen negative. Mammography was done in 3 patients out of which 1 patient reported BIRADS IV. Awareness talks on topics were by the consultants given.

Cervical Cancer Vaccination and Awareness Camp

27th November 2024

A Cervical Cancer Vaccination Camp was organized on 27th November 2024 at Sant Parmanand Hospital in collaboration with Innerwheel Delhi 301 & Okti Foundation. The event was organized with the goal of raising awareness about cervical cancer and providing vaccination to prevent the disease. The event aimed at educating the public, especially women and young girls, on the importance of vaccination and screening as a preventive measure against Human Papilloma virus (HPV), the leading cause of cervical cancer & cancer related deaths. This camp was part of an ongoing public health initiative to reduce the incidence of cervical cancer and empower women with the knowledge of preventive healthcare.



Vaccination Coverage and Participation

Targeted Demographics: The camp primarily focused on women and girls aged 9- 20 years, as the HPV vaccine is most effective when administered before exposure to the virus. A significant number of young girls from schools and local community centres attended the event. Mother of these your girls were motivated to get cervical cancer screening done.

Total Vaccinations Administered: 138 participants received the vaccine, with many more showing interest in follow-up doses.

Feedback: The feedback from participants was overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing appreciation for the free service and the valuable information provided during the health awareness sessions.



Conclusion:

By continuing to offer such programs, we can significantly reduce the risk of cervical cancer, develop herd immunity and improve the overall health of women across the region.

Key Highlights of the Event

Vaccination Drive: 138 girls received HPV Vaccination out of which 83 girls received 1 dose and 55 girls received 2 dose. Health professionals provided guidance on the two or three-dose vaccine schedule.

Sensitization of women with awareness lectures was done by Dr Saritha Shamsunder, Dr Sonal Bathla, Dr Sweta Balani, Dr Shalu Jain, Dr Anju Bala, Dr Payal Agarwal.

Thermocoagulator was donated by Innerwheel Club for the treatment of cervical pre cancerous lesions to the Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology.
